Bog Grog (Consumable Item)

Murky demijohn of waterlogged liquor dredged from the mired depths of Dalamase.

Cures the effects of Poison.

Nisargan fishmongers fetter their casks with buoys and weighted sinkers to age in the region's cool marshwaters. This process imbues the fermentation with properties similar to antitoxin, as well as nutty earth tones and bold notes of peat moss.

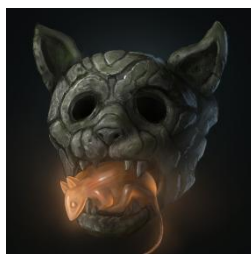


Corpse Petals (Crafting Material)

Phantom petals fluttering from the rot of those decayed in scorn of death.

Used in crafting recipes.

Verminous Alms (Partial Shard of Renewal)

A loathsome bounty given in gift unto the Sacred Six for want of renewal.

Offered in exchange for safe passage to an Ellarial Font last honoured. An indulgence of 20% garnered Kris is paid in penance upon absolution.

The road to atonement is a journey suffered alike by calloused foot and oiled paw.



Thurible Brew (Quest Item)

Masterful alchemicraft concocted in lunacy by the woods witch, Zazagrul.

Used to transmute corruption.

Fermented from an infusion of fell components and powerful aromatics, this flameless censer smoulders with an incessant haze, reminiscent of Ailur's Awakening.



Beloved Baklava (Consumable Food)

A flaky pastry favoured by Syko's Padishah for its elegance and emerald hue.

Gradually restores Mana [over a short/long duration / until death].

Rumour has it, through the silken veils of their shrouded palanquin, the shadow of a child whispers sickly to his trusted Vizier a desire to sup upon sweets from afar.



Lingering Favour (Health Recovery Item)

Favour of Rubinus, long forsaken by one without.

Expend garnered Favour to greatly restore Health. Fades upon use.

Earned in earnest and cast aside, lest the weight of years become a burden best buried.
